FROM TAPPAN ZEE BRIDGE OR ORANGE COUNTY: NYS Thruway to Exit 14B (Airmont) to Airmont Road (right if coming from the south, left if coming from north) Airmont becomes High View Ave. Turn left on College Road and left into college entrance.

FROM HAVERSTRAW, STONY POINT, WEST POINT, POINTS NORTH: Take Route 202 West past the Palisades Interstate Parkway. Turn left at 3rd traffic light after the Parkway onto Route 306. Turn right at 3rd traffic light: Viola Road. Turn left at next traffic light: College Road. The campus is the next right.

FROM G. WASHINGTON BRIDGE, ORANGEBURG, POINTS SOUTH: Palisades Interstate Parkway North to Exit 9W onto NYS Thruway (toward Albany) to exit at 14B (Airmont Road) and follow the directions above.
